The Pit Firing Workshop with Chris Dunn is full. So far there has been

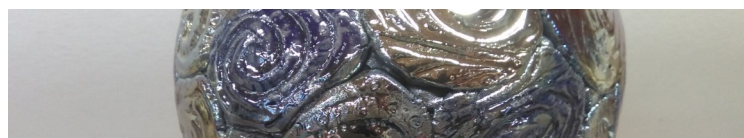

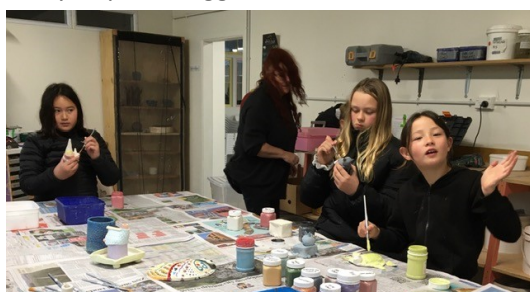

From Caitlin - We recently made a trip around the lower North Island which included a night in Whanganui.

One of the highlights was a visit to **Rick Rudds "Quartz Museum of Studio Ceramics"**. What an absolute treat! It is indeed Potters heaven.

Rick has amassed his own very substantial collection but recently inherited Simon Manchester's vast collection. Simon's passion for collecting ceramics began over 30 years ago and before he died he expressed the wish that his collection (of over 3,000 works) be gifted to the Rick Rudd Foundation with the intention of it being available for public viewing. An extract from a piece Rick has written on this collector " Simon collected works from many potters but rarely just one piece from a maker. He often had numerous works - collections in their own right. The whole collection will now be available as a national resource..."

Rick has such a quirky sense of fun... I spied four or five 1 metre tall columns with bowl shapes pressed into the top section - he called them "a set of bowls" !!

Here is another treat - "Does my bum look big in this T-Pot"

While Rick's gallery was the highlight for me, Wanganui has many other pottery studios and other types of studios to visit. Glassworks - where you can see glassblowing in action and see on display beautiful finished work.

Whanganui Pottery Club and the gallery next door are worth a visit and if you go on a Saturday the River Traders Market is operating.
