Festival of Pots & Garden Art 2015

Anam Cara 150 Rangiuru Road, Otaki. Saturday 17th - Sunday 25th January 2015

The goal of the festival is to provide a great experience for visitors while promoting potters and garden artists in their work.

This is the seventh Festival organised in Otaki and has been going from strength to strength each year. This will be the second 'Festival of Pots and Garden Art' to be held at Anam Cara. Last year over 1500 people visited the event paying only a small entry fee which included a raffle ticket, - school aged children were admitted free. We took over \$50,000 in sales an increase in the previous years sales. Pieces ranged in price from \$5 to over \$3000. We are hoping to increase these results again by encouraging more artists, showing a wider range of work and by increasing visitor numbers.


