We are also negotiating with Bruce to run further workshops working with plaster molds (either yours or his).

Jenny and Jojo have been reorganising the clay shed and testing new clays. All Southern Clays are no longer available now that the factory has closed. Primo Red/ Brown Terracotta is looking good. Good orange at 1140, darker to brown at 1220. There are samples beside the Clay Price Sheet. Other clays from Primo and Waikato Ceramics are in process. The committee has decided to discontinue stocking some clays - see the list in this newsletter. If you like using any of these clays get in quick while stocks last.

We need to appoint a Health and Safety Officer, so we welcome any nominees.

It is my job to empty the old kiln shed and Kaye has kindly offered the club storage. I need one or two people to help. This would count as a "cleaning bee". We need to have this done during the week beginning 1st May. Please contact me.

The College Board of Trustees has given us permission to install two containers on the south side of the gas kiln shed. Brent and Jojo are organising this. We will have to wait until later in the year for the ground to dry out before they can be put in place.

The committee has decided to upgrade the lighting in the rooms.

We are trialling a new system for pricing fired work based on a formula developed by Trevor Wright. We have adapted it for our situation and it seems to be working well. Feedback is welcomed, see Stephanie (geeup1@clear.net.nz) or myself. You now have to *the last day of the month following* to pay your kiln account. So you have until May 31st to pay for pots fired in April.

Ern has done a great job on putting new screws in the wheelheads and is steadily working through the batts to make sure that the holes fit. The screws have been engineered, sooooo... if you are removing them please <u>make</u> <u>sure that they go in the labelled plastic container</u>.

The first meeting for the Festival of Pots 2018 has been held. It was a really positive meeting and all the issues raised at the AGM have been addressed. Peter and Julie Collis from Auckland have agreed to be our guest potters and George Thompson from Waikanae is our guest painter. We are off to a flying start.

We are having a fish and chips 'pot-in' for the Empty Bowls project on 9 June. Handbuilding and wheel clay provided. Keep an eye on the noticeboard. More info in the newsletter.

Empty Bowls NZ was launched in 2015, building on an international idea and a lot of questions about how to support our community. The initiative encourages potters to make and

donate bowls to be sold in order to raise funds to support Wellingtonians in need. Over 900 bowls were made and sold in 2015, raising almost \$20,000 for Wellington's Downtown Community Ministry.

The Empty Bowls initiative is being run again this year. The bowls will be made by a community of professional potters and members from OPC, Wellington Potters Association and Porirua's Woolshed Potters. Bowls can be turned or hand-built and the only requirement is that they are food-safe.

All clay is being generously supplied by Waikato Ceramics and all bowls will be sold via Moore Wilson, at their Wellington city, Wairarapa and Porirua locations, from Saturday 2 September.

New Firing Charges Trial

We are trialling a new system to get greater consistency in charging for firing. The trial started on April 4th and will run for five bisque firings before being reviewed. Very Small Pieces = \$1 each or less

Subs

Member: \$120 per year

(includes key)

Associate member:

\$35 per year

- Small Pieces (Coffee mug/ small bowl) = Length + Height
- Medium Pieces (Plates/ bowls) = Length + Height x 2
- Large Pieces (Platters/large bowls/sculptures)= Length + Height x 3
- Once fired = Length + height x 2 divided by two thirds

Club Notices

- Member's kiln accounts need to be cleared by the end of the following month to avoid a 10% penalty
- Please leave the club rooms clean and tidy; if you cant clean it don't use it
- Please remember to number your work for firing. If you have multiple small pieces please identify at least two of them. Unnumbered work is charged out at a higher rate. If you have your own mark please make sure that it is registered in the front of the kiln book.
- The College has informed us that dogs are not permitted in the school grounds
