The **Twilight Raku** will be held on Friday March 4th, 4.30 - 8pm with a shared BBQ tea so even if you have nothing to fire come along and socialise. Bring something to BBQ, something to share and your drink of choice.

Because of fire ban restrictions, the Club Pit Firing will now take place in Spring.

We do have enough glazed work for the bottom and middle of the gas kiln. As soon as we have enough work to fill the rest of the kiln we will fire. - e.g. copper red, Oribe, matt white, silverton blue, waikato white, Pots with these glazes will be fired in the higher shelves of the gas kiln. The **next Gas Firing** is scheduled for late March.

Brent and I met with Andy Fraser, Principal of **Otaki College**, and Ian McMillan, the Executive Officer, for **our Annual Review**. The club will make a contribution, acceptable to both parties, towards waste disposal, water and toilet use.

The other issue discussed was around driving through and parking in the grounds. The Principal requires our members to understand access into the school grounds is a privilege and not a right. Access to our rooms is not a road way but through a playground. Drivers MUST NOT exceed 20km/hr driving in the grounds when the school is open, must park only in designated spaces and must not park on the unsealed area on the east side of the building. 


