PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings!

Winter has arrived. Potters are generally pretty hardy but heat pumps are a blessing!

We are coming to the end of another busy term. Nearly all kilns are again operational which is good news because there has been a lot of work moving through the rooms. Not all work is moving fast enough. For the first time we reached the stage where was nowhere to put pots coming out of the kiln. It would be helpful if you could take bisque pots home until you are ready to glaze them. We will be clearing the shelves on July 7th so please make an effort to collect your work. We will clear the shelves at the end of each term.

The lighting upgrade has been completed so the place is a lot brighter. The guttering on the south side of the building is being attended to.

We are fully stocked with clay. We have **Mac's Whitestone** now available. Whitestone is good on the wheel and for hand building; raku to stoneware. Medium grog: firing range 1000-1300deg.C. Waikato Ceramics has informed us that the source of clay used in **Mac's White** has been completely exhausted and the supplier has ceased all operations at their extraction site. In response Waikato Ceramics will be using a new source to produce this clay (from batch/bag number 626 onwards). Brick Red Bag number C38 was taken from the clay shed recently but not recorded in the book and there is no record of payment. Could you please check if you are using this clay?

The **Public Raku** will be held on the first Saturday in December. Pot-ins will be held next term. If people prefer to make pots at home clay will be provided, please see me.

The Faces with Expression Workshop with Liz Earth was held on June 23rd. Lot's of fun and some very interesting

"expressions". Liz is a lady of much experience and it was great that she could share with us.

We have the **Inter-Club Raku** on July 21st. There's still time to get Pots made.

We have a **Pit and Barrel Firing Workshop** with Chris Dunn during September. More details in the next newsletter.

The next **Mentoring Group** with Jenny Shearer will start on September 7th (then October 5th and November 9th). Priority is given to those who have done 4 years in an Adult Class. Members must have the skills to be able to work independently. Cost is \$90. Limit 12 people. Enrolments will open on July 21st. Discuss with me if you are interested.


Registrations for the convention are ongoing, with a surcharge in the last week, but an early commitment would be appreciated!

A Pottery Residency in Canberra – Chris Dunn

Last year I visited the Canberra Potters Society and found that they had a great set-up. A gallery, retail shop, several rooms for work and classes, gas and electric kilns, studios available to rent and a studio and accommodation for a resident potter. I learnt that all I needed to do to be considered for a residency was to complete the application form on their web site https://www.canberrapotters.com.au/.



I was invited to be a resident potter in March and April this year. I had an excellent time. My obligations included providing a workshop for CPA members, giving a talk on and developing my own work, being available to assist and advise CPA members, and present some work for an exhibition. In return I received a lot of very friendly and helpful support, the use of a studio and accommodation, access to facilities and equipment, payment for the workshop I presented, and payment for materials and my airfares. The committee, management and members at CPS were very helpful throughout my stay. I was able to work on improving my pit and barrel firing techniques and develop some of the materials I use for creating colour on clay. I completed some excellent work for an exhibition in Canberra.

The best part of my residency was the workshop I ran over three weekends. The people doing the workshop were very keen, enthusiastic and involved. The workshop was detailed, covering making and burnishing suitable ceramic pieces, making pit and barrel kilns, preparing work and firing the kilns, and post-firing presentation.



I was able to improve my work and techniques as a result of the practical suggestions and improvements from the discussions and arguments we had during the workshop. The firings were very successful and everyone was delighted with their experience and their finished work. Phew! Canberra is a very picturesque and interesting place to visit. Great weather, amazing galleries and facilities, excellent bushwalking and countryside, places to eat, friendly people and not far from the coast. Canberra Potters Society is keen to have a closer relationship with potters and ceramic artists in the Wellington region. They want to encourage anyone interested in visiting as a resident potter or to run a workshop for them in Canberra to get in touch through their website. Please note that arrangements will vary and can be negotiated with CPA.
