of heads have been going through the bisque firings with no mishaps. Some people may be interested in finishing them with Liz Earth's Bronze glazes, if so let me know. It seems people are keen to do another workshop with Kay on torso's.

The Vivian Rodriguez's sgraffito workshop is coming up on the 14th & 15th May. There will be more information in this newsletter.

websites for the club and the Festival of Pots and serving on the FOP committee. Jeavons will work with Kay Stead on the library and research specific projects for the committee. At present Jeavons is investigating how to effectively heat the rooms and a possible system to extract clay particles from the air.

Thank you to those members who have written to the committee with suggestions and ideas. Letters and emails are tabled and discussed.

The plan is not to continue to grow the Festival of Pots beyond our ability as a club to manage it but rather put our energies into continuing making it a vibrant and exciting event that people

look forward to visiting. We hope members will be inspired and challenged to explore new ideas during the year and have work ready for the Festival in January 2017.

While the festival is an important fundraiser for the club it is equally important as a venue for members to exhibit their work and for the club to promote itself.



The question was raised as to whether the committee had a list of priorities for spending. After the special member's meeting last year the committee prioritised projects as follows...

- 1. Carry out repairs to the roof.
- 2. Upgrade the clay shed and raku sheds and paint the main door.
- 3. Replace the shelving in the kiln room.
- 4. Upgrade or replace the slab rollers.
- 5. Improve the heating in the rooms.
- 6. Replace the main cable from the college switchboard to the kilns to enable more than one kiln to be fired at the same time.
- 7. Upgrade the spray booth.
- 8 Add more plinths to the club's collection.

Items 1 - 4 have been completed. 4 - 8 are in process.

The painting of the buildings is on hold. The issue around storage and the efficiency of the workspaces in the rooms will come up for consideration this year. If members have any ideas or requests, please bring them to the committee's attention.

Both **Talisman slab rollers** are for sale. Priority will be given to members, please contact me if you are interested otherwise they will be sold on Trade Me.

The College will have no students in attendance from Thursday March 24th until Tuesday 29th. The term ends on Friday 15th April. Term two starts on May 2nd.
