PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings!

Unexpected challenges have necessitated some changes. The removal of asbestos and demolition work around the College during the school holidays meant that we had to postpone the inter-club raku and find another venue for the children's workshops; which were a great success. With limited access and the power being disconnected for several days meant it was pretty quiet in the rooms. However we did manage to get some work done around the place.

We have sorted the glaze samples on the shelves. Margaret has prepared 60 samples to test the gas fire glazes so you will have a better idea of possible results. I say possible because there is quite a bit of variation in the firing process. It's not like firing in the electric kiln where results are consistent no matter where pots are in the kiln and the atmosphere does not change during the firing. Depending which glazes you apply will determine where the work will go in the kiln. We fire in a reducing atmosphere where at certain temperatures fuel is increased and oxygen diminished; for example this turns copper red. The temperature range from top of the kiln to bottom is 1280-1312 deg C so it is important that if you want to use more than one glaze on your pot they must mature at the same temperature. If you are interested in firing in the gas kiln talk to Margaret Hunt, Jenny Turnbull or me. We could run a half-day workshop on using our glazes for gas firing. Let Margaret know if you are keen.

Health and Safety....we provide gloves but you need to provide your own mask when glazing, especially when spraying.

Registrations are open and are rolling in! Having a Ceramics NZ convention practically in your backyard is an opportunity not to be missed, as it happens only about once in ten years.

We have four wonderful masterclasses lined up on dates before and after the convention proper at three different clubs. Jane McCulla will run a master class at Hutt Art Society on Thursday and Friday 16/17 August. Originally from Ireland, and with honours in 1st Class BA Hons Fine & Applied Art at the University of Ulster, she and her family came to NZ about eight years ago and Jane has just become a NZ citizen. Yay, Jane!

Jane is the Canterbury/West Coast Regional Council member for Ceramics NZ as well as vice president, and as such has been proactive in organising the Biennial National Tableware Exhibition, other regional exhibitions and setting up a co-op at Stoddard Cottage in Diamond Harbour. Not only that, she is an award winning ceramic artist. Among others, she has won a merit at the Portage, and her "Mythical Vessel" also received a commendation at last year's National Exhibition in Whanganui. Recently, she spent an 8-week residency in Jingh- de-Zhen, China.

At her masterclass she will help you make sprigs and make vessels with textured and stretched slabs of clay. She applies slips and wiped back glazes to give her work that earthy, ancient look. This will be a hands-on class suitable both for experienced and not so experienced potters. I'm sure she will have lots of interesting stories from her time in China as well.

We are looking for a few people able to offer billeting to out of town participants in the master classes. The guests will pay \$30 per night/breakfast directly to their host. Preferably the host will live within an easy commute to a club or be participating in the masterclass themselves and able to share transport. 
