PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings!

Some people in the mentoring group have been exploring and experimenting with Deco Glazes. There are a series of test samples laid out in the glazing room for members to

view for a short time. These glazes work best at either 1200 or 1220 degrees C on a white/pale clay. The plan is to make these glazes available <u>to members</u> to try while stocks last. We will produce an information sheet for people to follow to get the best results. We don't intend to provide Deco Glazes for general club use. Members can purchase these direct from Decopots in Palmerston North. If you need further help contact me or Paula Archibald.

Classes will recommence in the week beginning May 6th. I think all classes are full but if you need more information contact Margaret Hunt.

Because of restricted access we now need to arrange our clay and bulk supplies 3 months ahead so we begin term two well stocked. Thanks to David Timperley for doing the hard yakka.

Safe handling of glazes during application

Some of our 1250/1260 gazes contain appreciable amount of toxic oxides and carbonates, most often those of barium, chromium, manganese, cobalt, copper, and lithium. We mark these glazes as being "Not Food Safe" and strongly recommend that they not be used inside bowls and other tableware used for food.

While OPC members take these warnings seriously, they happily mix and handle the same wet glazes with bare hands. Remember, you are responsible for your own safety when glazing pots. Please wear disposable gloves – we provide them free – and dispose of them after ONE use.

Glazes made in the past month

Low fire glazes (1080-1100 C) - lead bisilicate+chrome (yellow), Potters Palette+copper (Emerald), Potters Palette+chrome (Lime), Abbots Clear+copper (Very Pale Green), Abbots Clear+cobalt (Pale Cobalt Blue).

Other glazes – Cone 6 Shiny Clear (1200 C), Satin Black (1250 C), Abbots Clear and Abbots White (1100 to 1250 C).

ERIK OMUNDSON WHEEL WORKSHOP

Erik is from Hawaii and visiting New Zealand later in the year. We have been offered the opportunity to have him for a two-day workshop on November 23rd and 24th. The first day will be a demonstration of making large pots and "loose" pots for 15 people. Day two will be a hands on workshop for 10 people. The fee for day one is \$35; for day two is \$40. For both days \$75.

Erik Omundson heads Donkey Hill Arts and Ceramic Department in Hawaii. In 1995 he came to New Zealand to be Mike O'Donnell's apprentice at Tarariki Pottery in Paeroa. In 1997 he worked as Barry Brickell's thrower and wood kiln firer. At Driving Creek Erik produced a

formidable amount of work both sculptural and domestic. He stayed 13 years then returned to the US.
