The 2018 NZ Ceramics National Convention has been and gone and I was lucky enough to attend. As it was being held in Upper Hutt and so close to home it was an opportunity not to be missed.

Opening night at Expressions Whirinaki, Upper Hutt, allowed those attending to have first look at a wonderful exhibition of contemporary studio pottery and I do strongly recommend that everyone come along and see it. Especially good was that Mike Page claimed the First Time Exhibitor award. Well done Mike.

The Expressive Ceramics team provided a very full weekend with presentations morning and afternoon from such a variety of potters that i wanted to see how all of them worked and found it tricky to manage. It was only by deftly placing my self at the edge and between two groups that I succeeded.

Greg Daly kept me going for nearly the whole of the Saturday ,talking about and demystifying glazes and glazing , while beside him Stevie Houkama was carving intricate designs in clay with amazing ease.

On Sunday I attended Mollie Bosworth's presentation on etching and decal application,, wonderful delicate and precise work, with Jane McCulla demonstrating her beautiful hand work right along side. Kate and Will Jacobsen had a large number of potters attending their presentation on Naked Raku and the use of mica on Raku pots.

Royce McGlashen, the Selector for the 2018 Exhibition, Greg, Jane and Mollie also presented to the whole conference, talking about their pottery and sharing pictures of their work by power point presentations.

While we spent much time learning from these folk there was also time for dining and dancing and Saturday evening was lots of fun, kicked off by a "hat competition" . (The potter wearing the tiny teapot as a fascinator deservedly won)

Not to be forgotten was the opportunity to buy from pottery suppliers at good discounts.


Attending the Jacobsens workshop on "naked raku" before the Conference was a bonus. I had seen their work on line and admired the wonderful colours and designs. It was a surprise to learn that the colours were acrylic paint, applied after the raku process. I guess we should all think outside the square, mixed media certainly gives a different opportunity and outcome. Each of us attending this workshop had different and varied results, dependent on type of clay, and terra sigilata and how vigorous the burnishing..

All up it really was a great learning time, and so good to meet potters from all over NZ and even some from Australia, and I would recommend it to all.









OPC Bus Tour August 2018

Our tour started at **Jenny Turnbulls studio** - **Jailhouse Pottery** - in Otaki. Jenny's range of work is always inspiring, showcasing a variety of techniques and styles. Inspiration from her past -seamstress, print and pattern maker- and her environment obviously coming through in her work. Her collection of gas and electric fired domestic-ware including intricately patterned jugs, colourful bowls and cups, and some fun with antique bottles on show. A group of pots standing out in the studio with their earthy tones –a variety of surface technique, the results were fantastic.



An hour later we arrived at Summerstone Ceramics, the home of Judy and Mike Page, where in the converted stables they had set out an exhibition of the work of many local artists, (list below*) along with a collection of Mirek Smisek, Bernard Leach, Hamada and various other pieces in Colin Davies collection of Japanese Potters.
